## Mrs. Geo. Nelson Dies Suddenly

Funeral services for Mrs. George Nelson, who died suddenly of a heart attack, were held at the Baptist Church last Sunday afternoon, with Rev. Rodney Gist officiating. Mrs. L. J. Rasmussen was the soloist, accompanied by Mrs. Harald Ibsen. Pallbearers were: Sam Jensen, Glenn A. Johnson, Eddie J. Madsen, Lauris Olsen, Edgar Dickerson and James Anglin. Interment was at the Baptist cemetery east of town, with the Viborg Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. •

Anna Morrison was born March 2, 1877, the eldest daughter of Nels C. and Caroline Morrison, who were homesteading near Viborg at the time. She grew up in this vicinity and on April 25, 1900, she was united in marriage to Martin Fredrickson, but Mr. Fredrickson passed away in 1920, leaving her a widow with three children.

In November of 1930 she made a second marriage to Mr. George Nelson who preceded her in death in 1948.

Mrs. Nelson's life was spent as a housewife and mother. She has been a member of the Baptist Church since she was a young woman and she was very active in community affairs. She has been a member of the following organizations: What I Can, Rebeccas, Eastern Star, American Legion Auxiliary, Danish Sisters, the Garden Club and the Extension Club. She was also Turner County Chairman of the Red Cross for 12 years.

She is preceded in death by her parents, seven brothers and sisters, Walter, Nora, Emma, Minnie, Clarence, Arthur and Henry. She is survived by two brothers, Lewis of El Centro, Calif., and Frank of Seattle, Wash., and three children, Irma, Mrs. W. L.
