Mr. Jacob A. Jacobsen was born in Denmark June 2, 1862, and died at Vashon, Wash., July 5, 1927, being at the time of his death 65 years, 1 month and 3 days.

Mr. Jacobsen came as a 10 year old lad with his parents to America. First they located in Chicago, Ill., but a few years later they moved to South Dakota and here the boy grew up the influence of the Lutheran church, of which his parents were charter members. Having grown to the age of manhood he took homestead in the northern part of the state. In the last of the nineties he went to the western coast (Washington) and later he found his way to Alaska, where he spent several years making a trip to Seattle, Wash., now and then and on one occasion visited also this vicinity to live over again the days of early youth and meet with relatives, friends and old acquaintances.

Mr. Jacobsen leaves to mourn his loss two sisters, both widows, with their children. They are Mrs. John H. Nielsen of Sallem, Calif., and six children, and Mrs. O. C. Stuart of Chamberlain, S. D., and two children. The last mentioned was here for the funeral.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. J. J. Lerager at the South Lutheran church Friday, July 16th, and interment was made in the Rose Hill cemetery.
