Frances Ann Churchill was born in Zion, Wisconsin, May 6, 1852, where she lived until January 1, 1870, when she was married to Mr. Francis A. Bartle, of Luna Wisconsin. To this union were born seven sons and two daughters. One son, Frankie, passed away in infancy, Charles dying in 1899 from a disease contracted in the Spanish-American War. In 1887 she moved with her husband to McPherson County, South Dakota, and from there to Turner County in 1890, where she has resided the balance of her life. Her husband having passed away June 20, 1913, she has made her home since then with her children, living the past ten years with her daughter Mrs. eGeorgeson, at their Spring Valley farm.
