Funeral Held For Dwight Andersen

Dwight was a very active and faithful member of Our Savior's Congregation. He was on the church council for several years.

He was a 60 year member of the Viborg I.O.O.F., Lodge of Viborg. He also belonged to the Encampment, and Patricarchs Militant of the

Lodge. He was a member of the Farmers Union for many years, and the last years very active in the Senior Citizens of Viborg. He was also a member of the Fraternal Funeral Home Board which he had been a member of for 25 years.
