Cora C. Christenson was born September 27th, 1875 on a farm 2½ miles east of Viborg, and grew to womanhood in this immediate vicinity. She received her education in the country schools, and for nearly two years clerked in Ebsen's Shore at Center Point.

On June 24th, 1897 she was united in marriage to George Nelson and moved to Viborg where they have resided ever since. To this union were born 10 children; 9 of them living: Everett W.; Margaret E., now Mrs. Guy Buckstead; Merton A.; George Emmett; Louise E.; Lillian M.; Joy M.; Ralph C.; and Elbert H. Nelson. Herbert H. died in 1916 at the age of six weeks, being a twin of Elbert H. There is one grandchild a little girl of whom Mrs. Nelson was exceptionally fond.

Mrs. Nelson confessed her faith in Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and united with the First Baptist Church of Viborg in the spring of 1893. She has since that time been a consistent Christian and church member.

She was a kind and loving wife and devoted mother. She loved her home and family and gave her life for them for she was always in the home. She will be missed for her place will be empty and her seat vacant.

She suffered much during the past year. It was generally understood

she would not survive her illness long. She was patient in her affliction and pain, till on last Saturday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, May 29th, 1926, she was relieved of her suffering when the good angel of Death called her from these earthly scenes and trials to another world where all sorrow and trials are at an end. She entered into her reward and is now at "home over there" in one of those "mansions. Jesus has prepared for those who love him and do his will.

Her age was 50 years, 8 months and 2 days.

She leaves to mourn her passing, her aged parents, Mr. and Mrs. Nels Christensen of Stockholm, S. D., three sisters and eight brothers, her husband and nine children, besides a host of friends and neighbors and relatives.

Mrs. Nelson was a member of Sunshine Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star, No. 154.

On Wednesday, June 2nd, 1926 at 2:30 P. M. the funeral services were held in the Baptist church with the pastor E. H. Clark officiating. The profusion of beautiful flowers and the large crowd of people in attendance told something of the high esteem in which Mrs. Nelson was held in this community.

Interment was made in the Rose Hill cemetery. The Order of Eastern Star had charge of the services at the cemetery, which were beautiful and impressive.
