FUNERAL

Martin C. Morrison was born in Vensysel, Denmark, July 7, 1863.

In the year of 1882, Mr. Morrison came to America together with his older brother, Andrew and settled near Viborg, S. D. After 2 or 3 years he left this community and took a homestead in western Nebraska, from which place he returned after 5½ years to this community.

In the year of 1894 he was married to Jorgina Kirstine Jespersen. To this union were born 6 children: namely—Lily, Mrs. Martin P. Anderson; Rosa, Mrs. Chris Johnson; Miller, Newel, George and Charlie.

Mr. Morrison was well known in this community. After about 6 years of sickness and failing health, spending part time at home, nearly one year at a hospital at Sioux Falls and now over two years at Yankton, he passed away Sept. 8, 1933, being 70 years, 2 months and 1 day old.

He leaves to mourn his death his wife, Mrs. Morrison, their 6 children; 5 grandchildren, one sister, Mrs. Chris Myer of Troy, S. D., two brothers, Theodore of Irene and Andrew of Albert Lea, Minn.

Also many friends and neighbors among whom Mr. Morrison held their high respect.

He was buried at Turkey Valley Lutheran cemetery, Sept. 12. Rev. N. P. Nielson was in charge.
