Funeral Services For Mrs. L. A. Christensen Held Here On Sunday

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon, March 20th, at the South Lutheran Church for Mrs. L. A. Christensen, who passed away on Friday, March 18th, after an illness of over a year. For the past two years Mrs. Christensen had made her home with her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Dan Danielsen, until she was hospitalized seven weeks ago. Rev. K. R. She was baptized in the Lutheran faith. At the age of 8 years she moved with her parents from Chicago to their homestead near Center Point.

She was united in marriage to Lars Christensen on November 15, 1892. To this union four children were born, three sons and one daughter. Mrs. Christensen spent most of her life in Center Point, where she and her late husband were engaged in the general merchandise business for many years. In 1950 she moved to Viborg where she lived until the time of her death. She was a member of the Meldal Lutheran Church and always was an active member in the ladies aid.
