

Funeral Services Held For Mrs. Carl Fredericksen

Long-Time Resident Passes After Operation In Sioux Falls

Laura Ingeborg Kristiane Hansen was born on the 13th day of March, 1876 at Sorø Sjaelland, Denmark. At the age of one and one half years she moved with her parents to Nestved, and at fifteen to Copenhagen. In 1893 she came to the United States and to Centerville, S. D., where she made her home with her uncle, Lars Nelson.

On the 15th day of March, 1894 she was united in marriage to Charley Monk, of Viborg, to this union of which four children were born. Namely: Clayton, Loretta, Hildon, and a baby boy which died in infancy. Her husband also preceded her in death.

On the 15th day of March, 1894 she was married to Carl Fredericksen, of Viborg, with whom she journeyed the remainder of the years allotted to her. Mrs. Fredericksen has not been entirely well for several years. Of late she has been decidedly worse and was taken to the McKennan hospital at Sioux Falls, S. D. on Tuesday, April 11, for a serious operation. She passed away at the hospital on Wednesday, April 19, 1939. She attained the age of 63 years, 1 month and 6 days.

Besides the husband, Mrs. Fredericksen leaves to mourn her passing, her daughter, Mrs. John Miller, of Viborg, S. D.; and two sons, Clayton, of Los Angeles, Calif., and Hildon, of Chicago, Ill. There are seven grandchildren and one great grandchild. Three sisters and one brother are Mrs. Valborg Jensen and Mrs. Helene Larson, of Viborg and Mrs. Holger Christensen, of Cudahy, Wisc., and Soren Hansen, of Sioux Falls. Many friends sincerely regret the loss sustained by her death.

A kind and devoted wife and mother has found rest from her labors. May the grace of God, and the peace that passeth all understanding, be hers, now and forever.

Funeral services for Mrs. Fredericksen were held on Sunday, April 23rd, from the home and the Baptist church, with Rev. Harris Jerpersen officiating. K. L. Raynie directed the funeral. Interment was at Rose Hill cemetery.
