Mrs. Anderson was one of those commendable women who lived unselfishly - whose aim in life was to make a real home for her husband and 12 children, which she succeeded in doing even under most trying circumstances. This mother richly deserved the devoted attention and love that her children bestowed upon her at all times. Into whatever neighborhood she moved, she made friends because of her cheerful and friendly manner that she truly possessed.

Mrs. Anderson enjoyed life as evidenced by her friendliness toward all whom she met and it was with keen sorrow to her family and friends when her health began to fail about two years ago, which made it at times impossible for her to lead her usual active and happy life.

She was born in Halager, Denmark on February 8th, 1870. Her maiden name was Johanna Johannason. She came to the United States in April 1895 when she was 25 years of age. Her first home in this country was in Turner County and in July of the same year of her arrival here, she was married to Lars C. Anderson and in this county they lived until 1916 when they moved to a farm near Platte.

During the more recent years they lived near White Lake and on December 5th, 1946, she passed away at her home in White Lake.

Mrs. Anderson is survived by her husband, her children, Mrs. Cecelia Wells, of Kimball, Martin Anderson of White Lake, Mrs. Margaret Jensen of Black Hawk, John M.
