Mrs. Joyce Nona Eckstein was born March 7, 1913, on a farm west of Centerville. She passed away Nov. 3, 1959, at the Pioneer Memorial Hospital at the age of 46 years. She was the daughter of Nels and Anna Johnson. Her folks soon bought the Johnson homestead south of Viborg and from there she attended the Viborg School. She was baptized in the Methodist Church and attended Sunday School there in her youth. She was a member of the South Lutheran Church at the time of her death.
