## Obituary

ANDREW J. ANDERSON

Andrew Jensen Anderson was born October 10, 1878 at Plano, Illinois. He was the son of Lauritz Hoyer Anderson and Maren, nee Larson. At the age of five years he came with his parents to Turner County, South Dakota, where he grew to manhood. On September 9, 1903 he was united in marriage to Sine Anderson. To this union five children were born.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith, and was a faithful member of this church until the time of his death. He passed away on March 10, 1945 after a lingering illness, having reached the age of sixty-six years and five months.

He leaves to mourn his departing, his widow; one daughter, Stena (Mrs. Waldo Tiahrt) of Marion; three sons, Hoyer of Menno, Paul of Dolton, Ervin of Viborg; six grand-children; two sisters, Mrs. Dorothy Olson of Chicago, and Mrs. C. J. Glood of Viborg. One sister, Mrs. Lars Jensen; an infant brother, and a son, Wallace, preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, March 14, at 1:30 from the house and 2:30 from the Salem Lutheran Church, of which the departed was a member. Rev. A. T. Daniels sang two hymns, "O Happy Home" and "Beneath the Cross of Jesus", at the house. He also brought a message. At the church the men's quartette, Gilbert Gullickson, Lewis Jorstad, George Brodland and Joseph Brodland, sang, "There's a Beautiful Land"; a duet, Mrs. Wilbur Odland and Mrs. G. Brodland, sang, "The Sweet By and By"; and the congregation sang, "Jerusalem the Golden". Rev. Kenneth H. Petersen of Spring Valley Lutheran Church and the local pastor, Rev. Daniels, spoke.

Burial was made in the Salem Cemetery. Pallbearers were: Steffen Jensen, Eddie Nelson, Alfred Knutson, A. T. Gullickson, Carl Hansen and Freddie Jensen.
