OBITUARY

Mathilda Anderson was born in Landskrona, Sweden, March 19, 1878. At the age of nine years she came with her parents to Blair, Nebraska. Here she was confirmed in the Danish Lutheran church.

Peder Nelson Anderson was born in Sarring, Denmark, May 30, 1874. At the age of 17 he came to Blair, Nebraska with his parents, sisters and brothers. He also was confirmed and united with the Danish Lutheran church.

On September 27, 1902 they were united in the bonds of holy matrimony and made their first home on their farm near Kennard, Nebraska. Here five of their children were born.

In 1914 the family moved to Centerville, South Dakota and in 1918 to the farm near Hurley, where they resided until their untimely death, September 12, 1931. They had gone to pay a last tribute to an old friend and were returning home when they were instantly killed in a railroad crossing at Walthill, Nebraska.

They were both members of the

Miriam Rebekah Lodge of Hurley and Mr. Anderson was a member of the I. O. O. F. of Hurley and the Danish Brotherhood of Viborg.
