Lillian Mae Gors was born in Turner county, near Hooker, S. D. on August 4, 1893.

She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Max Gors and was united in marriage to Mr. Fred B. Hollman in 1914 at Parker, S. D.

Mr. and Mrs. Hollman lived in and around Hooker until ten years ago when they moved to Hartford where they have since resided.

Mrs. Hollman attended the M. E. church, belonging to the Methodist ladies aid and also to the Rebekah lodge and Circle.
