### OLE ANDAL SERVICES ARE AT CENTERVILLE

Funeral services were held at the Scandia church here Wednesday at 2 P.M. for Ole Anddal, 80, who died at his home Friday evening. Burial will be at Holland cemetery.

Born August 28, 1869, in Skjold, Norway, to John and Rachel Anddal, he came to the U. S. in 1887. In 1893 he was married to Sarah Skonhovd, who preceded him in death three and a half years ago.

Survivors include nine children, Mrs. B. J. Osthus of Sioux Falls, Mrs. Walter Sorenson of Hooker and Mrs. Martin Osthus, Alma, Melvin, Alfred, Oscar, Joe and Roy of Centerville; 32 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren. —Argus Leader.

### OLE ANDAL

Funeral services were held on Wednesday afternoon for Ole Anddal, 80, at 1:30 from the Wass Chapel and at 2 o'clock from the Scandia Church, Rev. Frank Berg officiating. Mrs. Dewey Erickson was the organist. Mrs. Ole Taft and Mrs. Clarence Peterson sang a duet, and a quartette composed of Lauren Knutson, Boyd Ostrem, Willard Knutson, and Robert Ostrem sang.

The honorary pallbearers were Arthur Alendal, Thor Holt, Tom Hattervig, Thomas Ostrem, Ariel Knutson, and Louis Olson. Active bearers were Orville Osthus, James Anddal, Lyle Anddal, Merlin Anddal, James Osthus, and Clifford Osthus. Burial was in the Holland cemetery.

Ole Anddal was born in Skjold, Norway, on August 28, 1869. He passed away on Friday evening, March 24th, at his home west of Centerville. He had reached the age of 80 years, 6 months and 26 days.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith while still in Norway. At the age of 17 he emigrated to the United States with his mother.

On December 15th, 1892, he was united in marriage to Sarah Olson. To this union, eleven children were born: Oscar of Irene; Emma (Mrs. B. J. Osthus) of Sioux Falls; Mable (Mrs. Martin Osthus); Roy, Alfred, Alma, Joseph, and Melvin, all of Centerville; and Evelyn (Mrs. Walter Sorenson) of Viborg.

He is survived by nine of his children, 32 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren. Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, two sons, two sisters and one brother.

The first year of married life was spent on a farm near Hooker. In 1894 they homesteaded near Vivian, S. Dak., but came back to this vicinity in 1895, settling near Wakonda. From 1900 to 1922 they made their home on a farm west of Hooker and then moved to their present home west of Centerville.

Mr. Anddal was a charter member of the Bethlehem Lutheran church of Hooker. He served as deacon and held other offices in the church.
