Jack Hurd was born August 18, 1925, in Buffalo, New York, and passed away May 5th at the Sioux Valley Hospital in Sioux Falls at the age of 26 years, 8 months and 23 days.

In early boyhood Jack moved to California with his parents. He attended grade and high school at El Sereno, Calif.

On July 9, 1944, he was united in marriage to Eldene Jensen formerly of Viborg, and to this union one son was born.

Most of their years of married life were spent in Richmond, Calif., where Jack was engaged in construction work until March, 1952, when he was forced to quit due to ill health. They came to Viborg on April 4th of this year.

He was preceded in death by his only brother, and leaves to mourn: his wife, Eldene and son Larry, his father, John Hurd, Bellflower, Calif., his mother, Marion Litz, Los Angeles, his grandmother, Ida Hurd, Buffalo, New York, and many relatives and a host of friends.
