Services Held for Dean Polley

Funeral services were held Monday, August 31 at the Hurley United Methodist Church at 11:00 a.m. for Dean O. Polley with Rev. Randall Spahr and Dr. Earl Butz officiating.

Dean Polley, 68, son of Ford and Ethel (Cheney) Polley, was born in Hurley October 30, 1918, and died Saturday, August 29, 1987, at the Centerville Good Samaritan Center.

He grew up on a farm Northeast of Hurley and graduated from Hurley High School.

He married Esther Sanborn, June 26, 1960, in Hurley and they made their home in Sioux Falls. He was employed as a truck driver and salesman for Park Grant for 15 years, until illness forced his retirement.

He served in the Army Air Force during World War II serving in China, Burma and India. He was a member of the Sioux Falls VFW No. 628 and had been a resident of various nursing homes for the past 5 years.
