### CHARLES J. AALBORG

Charles J. Aalborg was born in Denmark on July 23rd, 1862, and died at Viborg, South Dakota, on July 5th 1940 at the age of 78 years 11 months and 12 days.

With his parents, he came to Turner county at the age of 13. He was baptized and became a member of the Seventh-day Adventist church on March 3rd, 1877. He was always a very earnest, active Christian, faithful in every detail. He ever cherished the blessed hope of seeing Jesus, and having a part in the heavenly kingdom. He was the second of a family of five brothers and one sister.
