HANNAH C. BARTA

Funeral services for Hannah C. Barta, 65, were held from the Viborg Funeral Home on Friday, Nov. 20th, with Rev. Floyd Bacon officiating. Pallbearers were Morris Wek, Lawrence Wek, Henry Gran, Knud Solberg, Peter Pedersen and Howard Pedersen. Interment was in Bang Cemetery.

Hannah Carline Gudmunson was born March 4, 1899, to Hans and Carrie Gudmunson at Madison, Wisconsin, and was baptized in the Lutheran faith on April 4, 1899. At the age of 3, she moved with her parents to Yankton County in the Menno vicinity, and was a member of James River Lutheran Church and was confirmed there Nov. 16, 1913.

She was united in marriage to Adolph Preyler of Menno. To this union 4 children were born. After 7 years, Mr. Preyler passed away.

In 1925 she was united in marriage to Iver Svartoiien of Freeman. To this union 4 children were born and Mr. Svartoiien adopted the 4 other children. Christmas of 1939 he passed away suddenly.

In later years she was married to Arthur P. Anderson, and to Niels Marinus Henriksen who are both deceased.

In 1958 she was united in marriage to Elmer Barta of Mitchell. On October 16 Hannah took sick and underwent surgery a week later. She returned home Nov. 3, but had to return to the hospital Nov. 10. On Nov. 16, she was stricken with a cerebral hemorrhage and passed away that evening at the age of 65 years, 8 months, 12 days.

She leaves to mourn, her husband, Elmer Barta of Yankton, and seven children, Arnold Svartoiien of Rockford, Illinois; Mrs. Adeline Boomgarden and Mrs. Viola Muchow, both of Sioux Falls; Lester and Robert of Rockford, Ill.; Cora, Mrs. Kermit Heckinlathle of Freeman; and Paul Svartoiien of Freeman. One brother, Lloyd Sorenson of Vermillion and 21 grandchildren, and a host of friends and relatives. Preceding her in death were one daughter, Dora Ione Svartoiien, 4 husbands, 2 grandchildren, her parents, 2 sisters and 4 brothers.

Since 1925 she resided in the Bang-Elm vicinity and she was a faithful member of the Midway Parish and a charter member of Bang Ladies Aid. She was a member of the V. F. W. Auxiliary. In the fall of 1951 she took up residence in Yankton and was employed at the nursery of Sacred Heart Hospital for the past 12 years.
