CHARLES H. HARTSOUGH

Charles H. Hartsough, son of Albert LeRoy and Harriet Hartsough, was born in Perry County, Ohio, February 16, 1875. In 1880 the family moved to Missouri, where Charles attended school at Staribury and started working on a local paper in that town at an early age. He also was interested in music and became a member of Pryor's 4th Regiment Band of St. Joseph, Mo., which was mustered into the army in the Spanish American War. Failing to get to go to Cuba, he enlisted in the volunteers and went to the Philippines, where he served 33 months.

Upon returning to the U. S. he came to South Dakota where he has made his home for nearly 40 years. On July 3, 1911 he was united in marriage to Miss Henrietta Dahlman of Marion. In 1915 he settled in Hooker, S.D. where he passed away Thursday, November 21 1940. To mourn his departure he leaves his wife one daughter Mrs. Reuben Jensen and two grand children of Rapid City, one sister Mrs. Kathryn McKee, one brother Harry of California; and a brother E. W. Hartsough of St. Joseph, Mo

Mr. Hartsough had been in ill health for several months and for years had been a chronic sufferer.

He will be greatly missed in political and newspaper circles throughout the state.
