and Three Sisters to
Mourn

Johanne Rasmine (Larsen) Andersen was born in Lindholm, near N. Sundby, October 2nd, 1897. She was baptized in the Lutheran faith and confirmed after being properly instructed by the pastor of her home town church.

In the spring of 1920 she came to this country with some relatives who had visited their old homes in the Danish peninsula, and on August 31st, 1921, she became the happy wife of Mr. Elmer Andersen of this vicinity. The nearly two years of married life that followed was to them like a beautiful dream, and when on August 11th, a little boy came into their home, the world did not seem to have anything more to add to their happiness. On the third day after the little boy's arrival the mother was stricken with scarlet fever, which in less than five days laid her low. She died on the weekday after her happy deliverance August 21st. she was laid to rest at the Rose Hill cemetery.

Besides her husband and infant son, Arlo Johannes who was baptized right after the funeral—three sisters and an elderly father mourns her loss.
