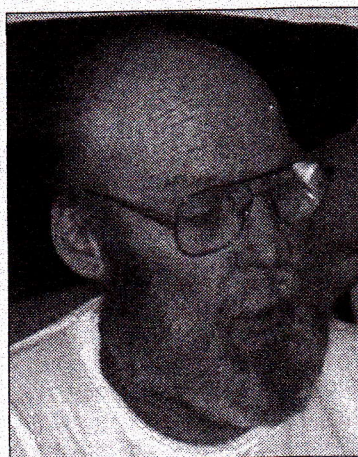

Pete Maydole, formerly of Healy, AK, passed away Dec. 10, 2003 after a brief, but courageous battle with cancer. Peter Dean Maydole was born to Fred and Lois (Avery) Maydole on March 8, 1943, in Cuba, NY. Pete moved with his family to Darby, Montana. He attended the Baker Creek School on the West Fork and the Darby School. As a young boy,

Pete became an avid outdoorsman and loved to track and hunt. Pete served in the US Navy aboard the USS Salisbury Sound and the USS Hancock during the Vietnam conflict. Pete was honorably discharged in 1966 and returned to the Bitterroot Valley and worked as a logger, truck driver, and fire fighter. Pete enjoyed racing snowmobiles and motorcycles. Pete moved to Alaska in 1972. He worked for Sealand and Sourdough Freight. In 1978, Pete was employed by Usibelli Coal Mine. Pete was a proud member of the Teamster's Local 959 and retired June 1, 2002. Pete married Linda Frisbee July 24, 1992. They loved to explore Alaska and spent summers at their camp in the Brooks Range. Pete will be remembered for his love of hunting, gold mining, and the great love and respect he had for the land.
