**NELS M. JACOBSEN
FROM CALIFORNIA
BURIED SUNDAY**

Niels M. Jacobsen was born in Denmark, Nov. 28, 1846 and passed away in Upland, Calif., Aug. 13, 1935 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Norman. He was united in marriage in 1867 to Mette Marie Anderson, who preceded him in death in 1902. To this union were born six daughters and three sons; two daughters having passed away. Carrie and Mrs. Dorothea Schmidt. He leaves to mourn his death: Mrs. Cenia Christensen of Halfway, Oregon; Mrs. J. P. C. Norman, Upland, Calif.; Mrs. R. W. White of Independence, Oregon; Mrs. Anderson and Andrew Jacobson of Lunds Valley, N. Dak.; Chris Jacobsen of Viborg and Elvin Jacobson of Greybull, Wyoming, 17 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren.

Nels Jacobson came to Racine, Wis. in 1869 and moved to South Dakota in 1883, settling on a farm northwest of Viborg, where he lived till he moved into Viborg, going to California to make his home, after the death of his daughter, Dorothea Schmidt nearly three years ago.

Mrs. J. P. C. Norman of Upland, California and Mrs. Cenia Christensen of Halfway, Oregon came here with the body.
