**Was Over 65 Years of Age**  
**at Time of His Death**  
**June 1st, 1923**

**FORMER SWAN**  
**LAKE RESIDENT**

**Funeral Services Held on**  
**Tuesday—Buried in**  
**Rose Hill**

Anders Christian Andersen was born at Bindslev Vensysel, Denmark, on April 12th, 1858, and died at his home at Lake Park, Iowa, June 1st, 1923 from heart disease, at the age of 65 years, 1 month and 19 days.

Mr. Andersen was married to Caroline Josephine Nielsen on November 30th, 1880, and to this union thirteen children were born. One of the children died in infancy and Conrad died in France on October 2, 1918, while serving in the army. Mr. Andersen is survived by his wife and eleven children—August, Christian, Martin, Julius, Elmer, Dagmar, Sofus, Theodore, Holger, Julia and Clarence, twelve grand children and four brothers and four sisters.

Mr. and Mrs. Andersen immigrated to America in the year of 1881, and located at Dwight, Ill., where they resided until 1910 when they bought a farm near Swan Lake, at which place they lived until the spring of 1921 when they moved to Lake Park Iowa.

Mr. Andersen had been failing in health for a number of years, and about three years ago suffered an attack of heart disease, but recovered and had been feeling fairly well until about four days before his death when he complained of not feeling well.

All of the children were here for the funeral, as was also his aunt, Pauline Andersen, his brother Anton Andersen, from Texas and his youngest sister, Mrs. Carl Nielsen from Chicago, and his sister and husband, Mr. and Mrs. O. P. Andersen from Cedar Falls, Iowa, and his cousin, Mr. and Mrs. Ben Andersen from Lake Park Iowa.

Funeral services were held at the home at Lake Park, Iowa, Sunday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Jones, pastor of the Presbyterian church at that place and the choir rendered several songs. Services were held at Viborg on Tuesday afternoon from the Erik Knutsen home and at the South Lutheran church, and the remains were laid to rest in Rose Hill cemetery, Rev. J. J. Lerager officiating.

By the death of Anders Christian Andersen, our church has lost a faithful member but we would rather consider his gain than our loss.
