## CONRAD ANDERSON LAID TO REST

Yesterday Viborg had its second military funeral for overseas boys, when the remains of Conrad Anderson was laid to rest in the Viborg Lutheran cemetery. The funeral was under the charge of the American Legion post of this place, and the funeral services were conducted by Rev. Evald Kristensen of the South Lutheran church, assisted by State Chaplain Rev. Eberhart, of the American Legion. The funeral service was very impressive.

Private Conrad Anderson was a son of Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Anderson, of Swan Lake, and at the time of his death he belonged to Co. M 163rd Infantry. He was born August 9th, 1888, in Dwight, Illinois, and moved to Viborg with the family in 1910. Later he worked in Iowa, near Storm Lake, where he registered on June 5th, 1917. He died October 2nd, 1918, at Camp Hospital No. 26, in France, of lobar pneumonia. He was at the time of his death 30 years and 2 months old. He leaves to mourn his loss his father and mother, two sisters and nine brothers: August, Chris, Martin, Julius, Elmer, Dagmar, Sophus, Theodore, Holger, Julia and Clarence all of whom reside in Turner county.
