OBITUARY ORLAND ANDERSON, PASSED AWAY MAY 16TH

Died From Injuries Received
in Auto Accident
That Day

LARGE NUMBER
RELATIVES MOURN

Funeral Services Held Last
Thursday From Home
and Church

Orland Chester Anderson, 20 years, 10 months and 14 days of age, passed away May 16, 1927, at 2:00 o'clock P. M.; from injuries received at 7 o'clock that morning, when the large car driven by Nels Larsen of Viborg collided with his Ford roadster at the cross road on the gravel highway 8 miles west of Irene.

He was immediately taken to the Sacred Heart hospital at Yankton where medical aid was given. His folks were notified and his father reached his bedside at 9 o'clock. He was conscious at that time and rested quite well, but complications set in and after suffering intense pain from internal injuries, he passed away at 2 o'clock.

He was a home-loving, devoted son, always willing to do his duty towards his parents, brothers and sisters. Having lived in this community all his life, he was loved and respected by all who knew him. He was baptized and confirmed by the Lutheran pastor of Elims church and was a member of the Lutheran League and choir.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Anderson, of Irene; three brothers; Harvey of Viborg, Ralph and Roy of Irene; seven sisters: Mrs. Arthur Mack, of Oldham; Mrs. Walter Strunk, of Irene; Agnes, Edna, Hazel, Ada and Olive of Irene. In the trials of everyday life he will surely be missed. Blessed be his memory.

Funeral services were held at the farm home and at Elims Lutheran church of Irene. Rev. Ole Odland of Yankton preached the funeral services. Mrs. Herbert Horst sang several selections and Mrs. Harry Vedin played the piano.
