MRS. OLE ANDAL

Sarah Olson Andal was born on November 5, 1875 of Martin and Martha Olson at Rockdale, Wisconsin and passed away Tuesday morning, October 15, 1946, at the Sioux Valley Hospital in Sioux Falls, where she had been a patient for the past two weeks. Death resulted from complications following a fall in which her arm was broken. She had reached the age of 70 years and 11 months.

She was baptized at Rockdale, Wis. and shortly after her parents moved to South Dakota where they took a homestead claim, four miles southwest of Centerville. She was confirmed in the Nazareth Lutheran Church in Centerville by Rev. Langeteig, and on December 15, 1892 was united in marriage to Ole Andal. Their first year of married life was spent on a farm near Hooker. In 1894 they homesteaded near Vivian in Lyman County, S. Dak., but came back to this vicinity in 1895, settling near Wakonda. From 1900 to 1922 they made their home on a farm west of Hooker, then moved to their present home west of Centerville.

To this union were born eleven children: Evelyn, Mrs. Walter Sorensen, and Oscar, both of Viborg; Emma, Mrs. B. J. Osthus, Sioux Falls; Mable, Mrs. Martin Osthus, Alfred, Roy, Alma, Joseph and Melvin, all of Centerville. Two sons preceded her in death. Besides her own children, she found time and room to raise and care for her granddaughter, Alice. Besides her nine children, Mrs. Andal is survived by her husband, six brothers, Martin, John, Isaac, and Louis Olson of Centerville, Ole Skorhovd of Viborg, and Albert Olson of Irene; three sisters, Mrs. Johanna Satre of Beresford, Mrs. Peter Oakland of Centerville and Mrs. Cornelius Johnson of Sherman; 32 grandchildren, six great grandchildren. Her parents, three brothers, one sister and two sons preceded her in death.

Mrs. Andal had been a member of the Bethlehem Church of Hooker since its origin and was a charter member of the Ladies Aid of that church. She was a faithful, kind and loving mother, a good neighbor and friend, showing great patience during her illness and at all times. She spent her time in the interests of her family and friends. She was humble and sincere. Blessed be her memory.

Funeral services were held from the Scandia Lutheran Church in Centerville at 2:00 P. M. on Saturday, October 19, with Rev. I. Z. Hyland officiating. Pallbearers were: Orville Osthus, Merlin Andal, James Andal, James Osthus, Clifford Osthus and Lyle Andal. Burial was in the Holland Cemetery.
