LAST RITES HELD FOR PETER LANGELAND SATURDAY, DEC. 27th

Funeral services were held for Peter Langeland on Saturday, Dec. 27th, from the Langeland home at 1:30 P. M., and from Spring Valley Lutheran Church at 2:00 P. M. with Rev. H. S. Madsen officiating. Honorary pallbearers were Alfred Knudsen, Chris Mikkelsen, Jens Nielsen, Carl Knudsen, Kenneth Knudsen and T. F. Georgeson. Casket bearers were Leslie C. Anderson, Rolland Peterson, Clarence Jepsen, Ray Nielsen, Robert Kost and Kermit Mikkelsen. Burial was in Spring Valley Cemetery.

Peter Langeland was born September 7, 1893, in Spring Valley Township, Turner County, South Dakota, and passed away at Sacred Heart Hospital in Yankton on Wednesday, Dec. 24th, at the age of 65 years, 3 months, and 17 days. At his birth he lived on a farm west of Viborg that was home-steaded by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Langeland. He lived on this farm all his life.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith and at the time of his death was a member of the Spring Valley Lutheran Church. He served on the board of directors of the Scandinavian Co-op Creamery and also on his district school board for many years.

On August 11, 1915, he was united in marriage to Carrie Larsen at Parker, S. Dak. To this union was born three sons and one daughter. Preceding him in death were his parents, one brother and one infant son.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his wife Carrie, two sons, Earl of Menno, S. Dak., and Merle of Centerville, S. Dak., one daughter (Irene) Mrs. Warren Nilson of Alcester, S. Dak., 11 grandchildren, one great-grandchild, one brother John of Viborg, one sister (Katherine) Mrs. John Tarrell of Canistota, S. Dak., and many other friends and relatives.

He will always be remembered as a kind and loving husband and father and will be missed by everyone in the community as he was a good friend to both young and old. Blessed be his memory.
