MRS. MARTINUS LARSEN

Oline Margret Larsen, nee Nielsen, was born in Hjørring, Denmark on February 20, 1881. Here at the local Lutheran Parish Church she was baptized.

In 1884 her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Nielsen, and family of seven brothers and three sisters immigrated to this country, settling in the Spring Valley Community, then Dakota Territory. In this community she grew to young womanhood, being confirmed in Spring Valley Lutheran Church and receiving her elementary training in the local schools.

In the year 1902 she was united in marriage to Martinus Larsen and to this union were born three children, two of whom passed away in infancy. Mr. and Mrs. Larsen for a time made their home in the Freeman community, but after seven years returned to their original home and followed the occupation of farming until about a year ago when they retired and moved into Viborg. After an illness of two months, Mrs. Larsen passed away quietly at her home on Sunday, February 2nd.

Mrs. Larsen leaves to mourn her death: her husband, her son Andreas, and his family; three brothers, J. C. Nielsen of Stockholm, S. Dak., Sixtus Nielsen of Hurley, and Tom and Thorvald Nielsen of Viborg; also many other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were conducted on Tuesday afternoon at her home and the Bethany Lutheran Church, the Rev. M. Harry Pedersen officiating. Special music was furnished by members of the Adult Choir. Pallbearers were Marius Sorensen, Balsir Christensen, Paul Paulsen, Pate Petersen, Leslie Petersen and Nick Smith. Interment was in the Spring Valley Lutheran Cemetery. The Viborg Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.
