## PIONEER SETTLER PASSES AWAY

Peter Buck, of Center Point, Passed  
Away on Wednesday of Last  
Week at His Home After  
Short Illness

Peter Christensen Buck was born  
January 17th, 1858, in Sundby Mors,  
Denmark.

In 1878 he married Ludevikke  
Paulsen. To this union four chil-  
dren were born, of which two are  
living: Mrs. A. F. Miller, Tyler,  
Minn., and Lars Buck, Tyler, Minn.  
After a few years marriage his first  
wife died, and in 1888 he married  
Margaret Johansen. They immigra-  
ted to America the same year and  
settled near Viborg, S. D., where  
they have lived ever since. To the  
second marriage seven children were  
born of which only two survive  
their father. Mrs. Nels Jespersen,  
Viborg, S. D., and John Buck, Viborg  
S. D.

Peter C. Buck died on January  
20th, 1920, at the age of 61 years,  
30 months and 25 days.

He leaves to mourn him a widow,  
four children and a number of  
grand children, who feel keenly the  
loss of a kind and loving husband  
and father, one who was always  
young and cheerful at heart, ever  
ready to sacrifice for others even in  
times of trouble and tribulations.  
He was always known to be a free  
sinner. Wherever he could help Gods  
cause, trusting fully in the Lord as  
his redeemer.

He was buried on January 17th  
from his home and the Spring Val-  
ley church. In that cemetery he  
was laid to rest besides his five  
children who had gone before.

A great host of neighbors and  
friends, who all feel heavily the loss  
of one who by his kindness and  
honesty of manner had won a place  
in their hearts, followed him to his  
last resting place.

Rev. E. Kristensen officiated. Rev.  
Persild also spoke in the church.  
Both spoke beautiful words of cheer  
and comfort to the bereaved family.
