## OBITUARY

Caroline Josephine Andersen was born at Blindsley, Vendsyssel, Denmark, on the 24th of January, 1862. She died at her home in Newell, Iowa, November 14th, 1932 from heart disease, at the age of 70 years, 9 months and 20 days.

Mrs. Andersen was married to Anders Christian Andersen on Nov. 30th, 1880. In 1881 this couple immigrated to America and located at Dwight, Ill., where they resided until 1910 when they bought a farm near Swan Lake, S. D., at which place they resided until the spring of 1921 when they moved to Lake Park, Ia. Here Mr. Andersen passed away on June 1st, 1923. Mrs. Andersen then moved to Newell, Ia., where she lived until death also claimed her.

To the happy union of this couple thirteen children were born. One child died in infancy and Conrad died in France on Oct. 2nd, 1918, while serving in the army. Mrs. Andersen is survived by eleven children: August of Holland, Minn.; Christian of Viborg, Martin of Irene, S. D.; Julius of Sioux Falls, S. D.; Elmer of Newell, Ia.; Mrs. Dagmar Lund of Newell, Ia.; Sophus of Ridgeway, Wis.; Theodore of Los Angeles, Cal.; Holger of Peabody, Kansas; Mrs. Julia Nielsen of Newell, Ia., and Clarence of Point Loma, Calif. There are 32 grandchildren.

Mrs. Andersen had been failing in health for a number of years. However, during last summer she felt herself strong enough to visit several of her children in Minnesota and South Dakota. But upon her return home the disease again set in which resulted in her death.

Six of the children were present at the funeral, as were also, Mrs. Bendt Andersen and Mrs. Nielsen of Newell, Ia., and Mr. and Mrs. Peter Olsen and Mrs. Johnson of Sharon, Wis.

Funeral services were held at the home in Newell, Tuesday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Hakon Jorgensen of the Danish Lutheran Church of that place. Services were held at Viborg, Thursday afternoon, from the Erik Knudsen home and the South Lutheran church. The remains were laid to rest beside her husband in Rose Hill cemetery, Rev. Hakon Jorgensen officiating, assisted by Rev. Harris Jespersen.

Another faithful servant has gone to her well earned rest.
