Mrs. Joseph Pinney was born April the 25th. 1886 in Daneville South Dakota. She was the daughter of Andreas and Ingeborg Jensen. She has always lived in and about Viborg except for one year which she spent with her parents after they had moved to Minnesota.

She united with the local Baptist church on September 29th. 1899, while it was yet located in the country to the southeast of this city. In this church she was always a faithful attendant and a capable worker.

On February the 14th. 1917 she was united in marriage to Joseph Pinney also of this vicinity. To this union was born one child, a little boy, Warren who will be four years old the next December. This little fellow will sorely feel the loss of his mother.

About three years ago the health of Mrs. Pinney began to break. While she had the best medical care and while every possible means was used for her recovery still this proved unavailing. Internal Sarcoma, that most to be dreaded of all human ailments, gradually sapped her life. During this long period of ebbing strength and exquisite anguish she remained patient and uncomplaining. At last the end came peacefully on May the 7th., at 2:30 o'clock in the morning.

Mrs. Pinney was a most choice spirit and of a quiet, gentle nature. She was a benediction to all she touched and her friends were as numerous as her acquaintances. To her family, especially to the husband and little boy, her loss will be irreparable. May the Lord of consolation comfort their hearts and be their stay in this their hour of whelming sorrow.

She leaves as mourners beside the husband and the little son, her mother Mrs. Ingeborg Jensen, five sisters, Mrs. Arlo Monk, Mrs. Raymond Swensen, Eva Jensen, Ida Jensen of Viborg, So. Dak., Mrs. Elenor Beyers of Beebe So. Dak., and two brothers George Jensen of California and Roy Jensen of Minneapolis. Her father and two brothers Walter and an elder George are waiting for her on the other shore.

The funeral took place from the home, Friday, May 9th at 2:00 P. M. with the services at the Baptist cemetery, Rev. H. M. Anderson and C. E. Peters officiating.
