OBITUARIES

Funeral services were held for Mr. Einar Drugley Saturday, May 20, 1933. The deceased died suddenly from a heart attack Wednesday afternoon, May 17th while in Viborg. He had been in failing health for a comparatively short time. A short devotional service was first held at the Drugley home, located one and a half miles south of Center Point. Pastor Urness sang the hymn: "Does Jesus Care" and then conducted a short devotion after which Mr. and Mrs. H. B. Munkvold sang in Norwegian the hymn "Den Himmelske Hvile." From the home the funeral procession wended its way to the Meldahl Church, where a large audience was gathered. The pastor made use of both languages during the services and besides the sermons and hymn singing the Meldahl Choir sang one selection: "Just When I Need Him Most" and a trio composed of Mr. and Mrs. H. B. Munkvold and Mr. Clarence Knutson sang "Barnets Langsel." The burial service followed in the Meldahl cemetery. Besides floral tributes money was given in memory of Mr. Drugley to charitable purposes by some of the relatives. The following served as pall bearers: Ole Bak, L. Satrum, Louis Brunsvig, Ole Olson, Martin Durham, Ole Bjerkaas, Mr. Roy Nelson, assisted by his brother (Viborg) was the undertaker.

Mr. Einar Drugley was born in Meldahl, Norway, July 23, 1868 and was thus at death 64 years, 9 months and 18 days. He came to America as a young man and has lived in this community ever since.

May 20, 1899, he was married to Martha Margrethe Nielsen. To this union 9 children were born. Two have preceded their father in death. Mr. and Mrs. Drugley have been engaged in farming ever since their marriage, having lived in this vicinity ever since. They have with their family been faithful members of the Meldahl church for many years. For several years Mr. Drugley was a Sunday School teacher. As a father and husband he was conscientious and good. Besides his wife the following children are living: Mrs. William Jastrum, Hartford, S. Dak.; Mrs. Oscar Eide, Mayfield township, S. Dak.; Mae, employed at the City Drug store Yankton, S. Dak.; and Praben, Mabel, Edwin and Arnold residing at home. The deceased also leaves two brothers in Norway and 4 grandchildren. The Enterprise joins in extending sympathy to the bereaved.
