LAST RITES HELD FOR EINAR HANSEN

The tragic death of Einar Hansen on June 29th was a shock to the community. Funeral services were held on Saturday afternoon, July 2nd, at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, with Rev. Harald Ibsen officiating. Pallbearers were: J. Chris Nielsen, Jens A. Nielsen, Andrew Johnson, Lloyd Petersen, Wayne Petersen and Harvey Petersen. Interment was at Rose Hill Cemetery, with the Viborg Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Einar Hansen was born in Horsted, Denmark, on July 17, 1896, and passed away at his home near Viborg on June 29, 1960, at the age of 63 years, 11 months and 12 days.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith in Denmark.

In 1921 he immigrated to the United States and settled near Viborg, where he since has made his home.

He was united in marriage to Carol Andersen of Parker on Aug. 19, 1931, and to this union were born three children, Peggy (Mrs. Darrel Newman) of Virginia, Minn., Johnny of St. Paul, Minn., and Shirley (Mrs. Melvin Wollman) of Madison.

He was widowed in 1939. On March 1, 1948, he was united in marriage to Vera Andersen.

He was a kind and loving husband and father. He leaves many friends and relations to mourn his passing. He is survived by his widow Vera, his daughters Peggy and Shirley, his son Johnny, and four grandchildren. He is also survived by two brothers, Ditlev and Hartvig, both of Viborg, a sister, Mrs. Jenny Andersen of Sioux Falls, besides two sisters, two half-sisters and four half-brothers and his step-mother in Denmark.
