FUNERAL HELD FOR MRS. H. P. DANIELSEN

Mrs. Magnine Danielsen (Johnson) was born in Vedysel, Denmark on the 9th day of March, 1862. She was baptised and confirmed in the Danish Lutheran State Church of Denmark. She immigrated to the United States of America in 1892, coming directly to Turner county, South Dakota.

On the 6th day of January, 1893, she was united in marriage to Hans Peter Danielsen, to the union of which four children were born. Two of the children have preceeded their mother in death, two remain, one daughter, Myrtle, (Mrs. Andrew Andersen) of Menno, S. D., and a son, Jorgen Danielsen, of Viborg, S. D.

Mrs. Danielsen has been in poor health for a number of years. However, up until the beginning of the month of December, 1939, she and her husband were able to live by themselves in their home in Viborg. At this time she moved with her husband to the home of their son, Jorgen, where they have made their home until death claimed Mrs. Danielsen on the 19th day of March, 1940, at the age of 77 years and 10 days. Besides the two children, Mrs. Danielsen is mourned by her husband, eight grand children, two great grandchildren, and a great number of friends.
