Obituary

MRS. NELS C. LARSEN

Karen Christina Larsen was born on September 17, 1870 in Herning, Denmark, and passed away suddenly at Viborg, South Dakota on November 15, 1943, being, at the time of her death, 73 years, 1 month, 29 days. Her girlhood was spent in Denmark and at the age of 20, she came to America to the home of her sister, Mrs. Martin Christensen, who has preceded her in death. On December 4, 1891, she was married to Nels Christan Larsen. To this union, eight children were born, one of whom died in infancy. They made their home in the vicinity of Viborg during their married life and on May 7, 1931, Mr. Larsen passed away. Since then, she has lived alone at her home in Viborg, with the exception of occasional visits at the homes of her children. During the past few months, she has been failing in health but her death came very suddenly as a result of a stroke.

She was a faithful member of the D. S. S. Lodge and of the Danish Ladies Aid. She was also a faithful attendant at the South Lutheran Church, especially when the services were in Danish.

She leaves seven children, Chris and Harrie of Irene, S. Dak., Peter and Bertha Bartell of Ronan, Montana, Ida Hanson of Phoenix, Arizona, Clifford of Denver, Colo., Victoria of Nevada, Iowa, one step-daughter, A. J. Jager of Parker, S. Dak., 16 children, 3 great-grandchildren, one nephew, Alfred Christensen of Viborg, S. Dak., one sister and three brothers in Denmark, besides a host of friends, to mourn her sudden death.

Funeral services were conducted on Friday, November 19th from the home and Our Savior's Danish Lutheran Church, with Rev. Harris A. Jespersen, officiating, assisted by A. L. Hoffman. Five of the grandsons and the only nephew acted as the pall-bearers. Funeral arrangements were in charge of Clyde Hansen of Irene. Interment was made in Rose Hill Cemetery.
