OBITUARY

Relatives and friends of Peder Anderson were shocked and saddened by his sudden death which occurred Saturday noon from heart failure. He had just returned from town and after carrying some groceries into the house, he removed part of his clothing before lying down, for he felt tired. Death followed immediately.

Peder Anderson was born in Smoland, Sweden, August 10, 1863.

As a young man he came to this country and found work on a steam boat.

In 1883 he was married to Hannah Johnson at Yankton South Dakota, where they lived for a short time. Later they moved to Council Bluffs and resided there for four years. Then they came to their present home in Turner County, where they have lived since.

He leaves to mourn his death his wife, three sons, Oscar, Arthur and Louie; four daughters, Mrs. Sanford Erickson, Mrs. H. Strunk, Mrs. Elmer Ness, all of this vicinity, and Mrs. Claude Riggs of Sioux Falls; one brother, John M. Anderson of Bristow, Nebraska, and two sisters, and a brother in Sweden, ten grandchildren and a host of friends.
