## Obituary

### MRS. ANE MARIE ANDERSEN

Mrs. Ane Marie Andersen, nee Kaarup, was born July 13, 1877 in Sorring, Denmark, where she received her elementary education and training. At the age of 15, she came to this country with her family, settling near Dwight, Ill., where she grew to womanhood.

On February 20, 1896, she was united in marriage to Chris Andersen. To this union were born six children, one son, Martin, at the age of 20, preceded her in death. In 1912 the family moved to the Viborg community and have since that time made this locality their home. Soon after retiring from the farm and moving to the city of Viborg, Mr. Andersen died on January 10, 1935, just 12 years and one day before the death of his wife. After her husband's death, Mrs. Andersen continued to reside here and experienced much happiness in being surrounded by her children and grandchildren. Having been baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith, and being accustomed to positions of leadership within the Church, she found many opportunities in her declining years to deepen and to develop her faith in communion and fellowship with members of the congregation. Mrs. Andersen was also a faithful member of The Bethania Ladies Aid.

About three years ago, her illness, which proved fatal, manifested itself. Since that time, her children, especially her daughter Marie, have unfailingly cared for their mother until the day of her death, January 11, 1947.

She leaves to mourn, her children, Ernst, Denver, Colo.; Mrs. P. J. Vammen, Froid, Montana; William, Johnnie and Marie of Viborg; and nine grandchildren; also two brothers, Hans and Martin Kaarup, and many other relatives and friends.
