MRS. JENS C. HANSEN

Mrs. Jens C. Hansen passed away early Friday morning after a long illness. She has been bed-ridden for about six months and has been cared for devotedly by her husband and daughters. She clung tenaciously to life, hoping she might live to see her sons come back from the war.

Anine Christina Christensen was born at Nykbing, Mors, Denmark on the 14th day of May, 1891. She was baptized and confirmed in the Danish Lutheran Church of Denmark.

She came to the United States of America, and to Sioux City, Iowa, to the home of a sister in 1909. It was here that she met Jens Hansen, to whom she was married on September 15, 1910.

The Hansens lived in Sioux City for several years after their marriage, but eventually came to the Viborg community, where they lived the years, farming and in business, until Mrs. Hansen's death on March 24, 1944. Mrs. Hansen has suffered from ill health for several years and has been bed-fast the past one-half year. Although it was expected that she could not recover from her affliction, her passing, nevertheless, comes as a shock to those close to her.

The Hansens have had five children. Four living and one who died shortly after birth. The living are: Mrs. Anna Hansen of Parker, So. Dak.; John Hansen, U. S. Army, West Coast; Charlie Hansen, U. S. Army, in the Italian Combat Area, and therefore not present at the burial service; and Carolina Hansen of Viborg.

There are two grand-children, Carol Ann and Glennys Ann, who, naturally, meant a great deal to their grandmother. Besides the husband and children, a host of friends mourn the passing of Mrs. Hansen.

Mrs. Hansen was known as a kind and thoughtful mother, wife and neighbor, and, to our minds, seemed so indispensable. We trust that God in his mercy and grace will receive her into his kingdom.

Burial services were conducted from the home and Our Savior's Lutheran Church of Viborg on Tuesday, March 28, by Rev. Harris A. Jespersen of Clinton, Iowa. Interment was at Rose Hill Cemetery.
