Obituary

MRS. JOHN ANDERSON

Mrs. John Anderson, life long resident of Turner County, passed away July 8, 1945.

Sarah Amalia Christina Hill was born in Salem Township, Turner County, South Dakota, March 2, 1887, her birthplace being her residence through almost her entire life. Her parents brought her to baptism early although there was no organized congregation at that time.

She attended the public school which was then located on the southeast corner of their land. In later childhood she was confirmed by the Rev. Levorson. On Nov. 9, 1905, at the age of 18, she was united in marriage to John Anderson at the Bang's Lutheran Church, Rev. John Levorson officiating. To this union six children were born, one of whom died in infancy.

She was blessed with good health until June 22, when she was taken to the Viborg Hospital. On the 24th of June she was moved to Yankton, Sacred Heart Hospital, where she passed quietly away Sunday, July 8, 1945 at 10:45 A. M. at the age of 58 years and 4 months.

She was interested in the spiritual welfare of her children and always took an active part in the furtherance of her community in spite of many hardships.

Her immediate survivors are her husband, five children, Mrs. L. B. Eidsness of Hudson, S. Dak., Mrs. John Patterson of Iowa Falls, Iowa, Walter of Irene, S. Dak, Miss Verna at home, and Curtis with the army in Belgium; her mother, Mrs. Emma Hill who will be 87 in September; a brother and two grandchildren.

Interment was at Bangs Lutheran cemetery, the Rev. V. C. Hougen and John Levorson officiating. Mrs. Elmer Christopherson and Mrs. Herbert Horst sang at the home and Mrs. Lawrence Johnson sang at the church servi-

ces. Pallbearers were: John Edelman, John Pederson, Hans Sveen, Hjalmer Johnson, Caleb Lund and Oscar Wek.
