ARTHUR CHRIS- TENSEN PASSED AWAY SATURD'Y

Was Thirty-Eight Years of
Age At Time of His
Death

LEAVES WIFE AND
THREE CHILDREN

Six Sister and One Brother
Living—Funeral Sat-
urday

Arthur E. Christensen was born near Centerville S. Dak., October 31, 1889 and died November 19, 1927, having reached the span of 38 years.

In 1915 Mr. Christensen bought a farm two miles north of Irene, which has was able to operate until in the spring of this year, when he became handicapped by a weak heart. In an effort to remit the cause of the decease and make possible a chance for recovery an operation was tried but he was called to his reward.

A year after Mr. Christensen moved to Irene he was married to Miss Rose Thompson. To this happy union was born three children, Merle 9, Lois 6 and Warren 14 months old.

Arthur Christensen became a member of the Turkey Valley Baptist church in 1924 and has since served in the interest of the church and the cause of Christ well. He was one of the building committee who planned the erection of the new Turkey Valley church and has since in a efficient way served as church clerk. Mr. Christensen was deeply interested in the affairs of the community, having served on the school board several years, and was always for improvements that would be to the welfare of his fellow men.

He leaves to mourn his death, a wife and three children and six sisters: Mrs. Annie Helme, Minneapolis, Minn., Mrs. J. P. Hansen, Annabelle, Mo., Mrs. J. F. Anderson, Holbert, Okla., Mrs. Scott Taylor, Hawarden, Iowa, Mrs. Amanda Hagaman, Huron, S. D., Mrs. George Thompson, Viborg, and one brother Frank F. Christensen, Viborg.

The large family and a host of friends were at the funeral, which was held on Tuesday, November 22, at the Turkey Valley Baptist church. The remains was covered with a profusion of flowers and floral pieces. A quartet sang four selections, and the pastor of the church had charge of the funeral.
