FUNERAL SERVICES HELD IN CALIF. FOR ALFRED HENNINGSEN

Funeral services for Alfred Henningsen, a former Viborg resident, were held in the Memorial Chapel of the Ted Mayer Funeral Home in Ventura, Calif., on March 8 at 1 P. M. with Dr. Robert Pratt officiating. Soloist was Bill Proctor who sang "How Great Thou Art" and "Lead Kindly Light". The following casket bearers were three grandsons—Gary Jewell, Steven Jewell, and Larry Haywood—also Marty DeTavernier, Jim Smith, and Timothy Smith. Interment was at the Ivy Lawn Memorial Cemetery.

Alfred Henningsen was born on the farm near Viborg S. D., on July 21 1892, to parents Christine and Hans Henningsen, and entered into eternal rest on March 5, 1974, having reached the age of 81 years. In October of 1930, he was baptized and with his wife, joined the First Baptist Church of Viborg where he remained a faithful member until leaving Viborg when he united with the First Baptist Church of Ventura where he again served faithfully until his death.

On June 25, 1918, he was united in marriage to Esther Jensen, also of this community, and having attended the same school.

To this union, two children were born, a son, Verneil, and a daughter, Mary Joan.

Al was engaged in farming until 1922 when he moved to Viborg and operated a garage and Service Station for twenty-three years. In 1947 he moved with his family to Ventura, Calif., to establish a new home. He was engaged in carpentry and painting business and was active until his sudden death.

Al and Esther had enjoyed a wonderful companionship for 55 years, having celebrated their 50th Anniversary in 1968.

Preceding him in death were his parents; two brothers, Hans and Nels; and four sisters—Jensine, Henrietta, Martena and Minnie.

Left to mourn his passing is his beloved wife, Esther, son Verneil and daughter Mary Joan Jewell; six grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, three nieces and two nephews, and a host of friends.
