OBITUARY

Peter John Reinholdt

Peter John Reinholdt was born the 4th day of December 1863, at Glatstrup Skov, Raarup Sogn, Denmark.

His parents were Carl Peterson Reinholdt and Anna Catherine Sorrenson Reinholdt.

He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith, attending the public schools until he was 14 at the place of his birth.

In 1880, at the age of 17, he, with his parents, one sister and two brothers immigrated to the United States, landing at the port of Philadelphia, from where they went to Illinois. Here he was employed as a farmhand for a time.

In 1881, he moved to Turner County, Dakota Territory, where his parents had homesteaded the preceding year. Here he was employed as a farm hand and engaged in farming for himself.

On the 24th day of September 1892, he was united in marriage to Johannah Mathilda Christensen. They settled on a farm in Daneville Township, where they have resided ever since. He passed away at 9 o'clock Sunday night December 13th, 1931 at the age of 68 years and 9 days.

To this union were born ten children, John, Marius, Willie, Charlie, Elnor and Florence all of Irene, S. D., Katherine Anna, now Mrs. H. F. Hartwell of Arriba, Colo., Nora, now Mrs. E. J. Peterson of Hurley, S.D., Annie, Mrs. Charles Jeglum of Volin, S. D. and Howard of Viborg, S. D.

He leaves to mourn his bereaved wife and children, ten grand children, one sister, Mrs. Lona B. Mortensen of Irene and one brother P. C. Reinholdt also of Irene besides other relatives and friends.

One brother, Marius, preceded him in death, drowning in the summer of 1895, also three brothers who died in infancy.

The funeral services were conducted at the Maple Grove Lutheran church by Rev. E. M. Nielsen Thursday, December, 18, 1931.

Interment was made at the cemetery 3 miles west of Viborg.
