

Glenola's first husband was a truck driver for a rendering plant. This job would have been important in states like the Dakotas and Nebraska, but perhaps not so well-paying. As a truck driver for the plant, Fay Mattox would have gone out to farms and ranches to pick up animals that had died of natural causes, or in storms, and taken them to the rendering plant. The rendering plant would have extracted things like the fat and the hides from the animals for various uses. But since the animals were probably not freshly dead, the meat of the animals was not used or eaten. In the open ranges of the Dakotas and Nebraska where many cattle were raised, there were probably quite a few "rendering plants," especially in the larger cities (and probably still are).

By 1930, Glenola and Fay had two children – a daughter named Jene and a son named Harold. We know that at some point before 1941 Fay and Glenola divorced. **Glenola must surely have returned to live with family in Edgemont, South Dakota,** and surely she met Axel there. **Axel was living in Edgemont in 1938** when he made his Petition for Naturalization. **Both Axel and Glenola were still living in Edgemont when the 1945 state census was taken.** It is still not known if they married in Edgemont when they married in 1941, but Glenola's brother, Earnest E. Dibble, signed Axel's Petition for Naturalization in 1938, and he also lived in Edgemont.

The next attached record is Glenola's death record on the Social Security Death Index. **Glenola died in Edgemont.** The Social Security Death Index indicates that **Axel received his last Social Security check in Hot Springs,** some 43 km northeast of Edgemont, but there could have been at least two reasons for this. It may have been that Edgemont did not have its own post office at that time, but in 1983 this is rather unlikely. Another possibility is that **after Glenola died, Axel went to live with one of his children who perhaps lived in Hot Springs.** In any event, it is clear that Axel and Glenola never left the general area. **Glenola died 28 August of 1983.** And, we have already seen that **Axel died in 19 November of 1983,** only three months after Glenola passed away.

Loretta Glenda Anderson is buried in Section M Block 25 Lot 1 in Edgemont Cemetery and Reinhold Axel Anderson is buried in Section M Block 25 Lot 12. It appears that Glenda was Loretta Anderson's middle name, and we can only wonder if Glenola was a "nickname" that she used her entire life. But it is the right lady, as indicated by the birthdate.
