NELS ANDERSON FUNERAL HELD

Large Crowds At- tend Services

The tragic death of Nels C. Anderson on Thursday evening, Sept. 8th, came as a shock to the entire community.

Nels C. Anderson, son of Mr. and F. F. Anderson, was born on a farm southwest of Viborg on November 15, 1890. Here he lived his childhood years and grew to manhood. During these years he, together with his parents, attended the Baptist church and Sunday school of Turkey Valley.

In 1913 he was united in marriage to Anna Jensen. After their marriage they made their home on their farm in the same locality. Here their children were born and grew up, and this remained the family-home until 1937 when they moved to Viborg. At this time Mr. Anderson purchased the Rold Meat Market and continued in this business until his death.

He passed away at his home on September 8, 1938 at the age of 47 years, 9 months and 23 days.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from their Viborg home and from the Baptist church here. Rev. Einer Romer officiated and was assisted by Rev. John Jensen of Centerville. There were many beautiful flowers and a very large gathering at the home, church and cemetery. Burial was at the Rose Hill cemetery. The pall bearers were: Wm. Jensen, Eddie Madsen, Stephen Jorgenson, Herman Hansen, Martin Jensen and Elmer Schilling.

He leaves to mourn his loss besides his wife, three children: LaVaun, (Mrs. Ralph Christensen), Floyd and Delores, and two grand sons. He leaves also his aged parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred F. Anderson of Viborg, and four brothers and five sisters, all but three of whom live in this or adjoining communities. They are: Eddie Anderson, Mrs. J. C. Jensen, Mrs. John Riehardt, Mrs. Otto Nelson, of Devils Lake, N. D., Mrs. Just Peterson, Orden Anderson of San Francisco, Calif., Stanley Anderson, Leslie Anderson, and a foster sister, Mrs. John Robinson, of Sioux Falls.
