Funeral Services Held For Mrs. Millie Johnson

Funeral services for Mrs. Millie Johnson, a former Viborg resident, were held from the Viborg Methodist Church on Thursday, Dec. 30, 1965, with Rev. Emil C. Muhlhausen officiating.
