C. AUGUST ANDERSEN  
PASSED AWAY IN CALIF.

The sad news that C. August Andersen just passed away in California came to us just as we went to press. A telegram received by the relatives living here in Viborg is all the information that has reached here so far.

Mr. and Mrs. August Andersen and daughter left here for California about three weeks ago; and it was a shock to the relatives to hear of Mr. Andersen's sudden demise.

Two sons live in Viborg, one in Montana, and the youngest of their four children, a daughter, is with her parents.

We are in receipt of a letter from Earnest Andersen who is in Oregon. He also sends a paper from out there describing the terrible fire which occurred some time ago; when towns were wiped completely from the map and many lives were lost and thousands of people made homeless. He also states that he went with a volunteer fire fighting crew in open trucks for over 300 miles and had spent 96 hours fighting fire without a wink of sleep and that food was almost impossible to get when on the fire fighting line. Anyone interested in reading the account of the fire may come in and look the paper over.

Chresten August Andersen, son of Anders C. Andersen and Josephine Andersen was born on June 11, 1883 at Dwight, Ill. He died on the 6th of Oct., 1936, at the age of 53 years, 3 months, and 25 days, at South Gate, Los Angeles, Calif.

In 1910 Mr. Andersen was united in marriage to Beatrice Gould, at Cherokee, Ia. In the same year the young couple moved to Carter, S. D., where their first child was born. In 1912 the family moved to Viborg, S. D.

In all there were five children born into this family. Four boys and one girl. They are as follows: Dwight of Hurley, S. D.; Harold of Davis, S. D.; Leslie of Viborg, S. D.; Merle of Viborg, S. D.; and June of Viborg.

Together with Mrs. Andersen and the children, several brothers and two sisters and a host of friends, mourn the passing of August Andersen at this early date.

Mr. Andersen has for many years been a loyal and an active member of the Odd Fellows Lodge.

Interment was made on Tuesday, Oct. 13, from the South Lutheran church, on Rose Hill cemetery. Rev. Harris A. Jespersen officiating.
