

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

Student Council members started a recognition board called "Up Where You Belong" for students that excel in different activities. Their picture along with their achievement are put on the board for everyone to see.




# Students Become A Fulltime Challenge



## Future Farmers Of America Learn Aspects Of Agriculture


The Viborg FFA Chapter was under the direction of a new advisor this year. Mr. Joel Olerich came to VHS from Hartford.

superior at the regionals. Here she received an excellent rating.





## Seniors Adventure To Sioux Falls


This year's Seniors went to Sioux Falls for a day to end their high school years.


## Experience Builds Basketball Future
