MRS. AMANDA HAGAMAN

Amanda Fedora Hagaman, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Marcus P. Christensen, was born in Racine, Wisconsin August 22, 1882; came to Centerville, Dakota Territory in 1885 with her parents, who settled on a farm in Daneville Township, Turner County.

On May 3rd, 1911, she was united in marriage to Charles W. Hagaman of Wakonda where they farmed until 1918 when they moved to Calome, S. Dak. The following year her husband died.

Mrs. Hagaman was taken suddenly ill on Tuesday morning, March 20th, and taken to the Viborg Hospital, where she passed away the next day; she has made Viborg her home for several years. She leaves to mourn, two sons, John J., S.F.1c of U.S.N. and Carlyn W., A.C.M. of U.S.N., a daughter-in-law, wife of Carlyn of Portland, Oregon, one stepson, Orville of Port Angeles, Wash. and one step-daughter, Mrs. Marvin Davis of Long Beach, Calif.; two sisters, Mrs. Anna Helme of Pasadena, Calif. and Mrs. Geo. Thompson of Seal Beach, Calif., and one brother, Frank Christensen, of Huron, S. Dak., and many other relatives and friends. Her parents, three sisters, Emma, Hilda and Lucy, and one brother, Arthur, preceded her in death.

Funeral services were conducted at the local Baptist Church, of which she was a member, on Sunday, March 25th., the Rev. Paul M. Shellhouse, officiating. Interment was made beside her husband at the Wakonda Cemetery.
