FUNERAL SERVICES HELD SATURDAY FOR ART AGGERGAARD

Funeral services were held for Arthur Aggergaard on Saturday, June 9, 1956, at 2:00 P. M., in the Methodist Church of Viborg, S. D. Interment followed at Hillcrest Cemetery in Irene, S. D. Masonic and I. O. O. F. memorial services were conducted at the graveside.

Mr. Aggergaard, wellknown citizen and sportsman, passed away at his home on June 6, 1956, at the age of 75 years, 5 months and 9 days.

He was born to Peter N. and Elsie Aggergaard in Daneville Township, Turner County, on Dec. 28, 1880, the oldest of 8 children. He grew to manhood on his father's farm and on February 15, 1905, was united in marriage to Anna Olesen, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Olesen of Irene, S. D. Their Golden Wedding anniversary was observed in 1955.

For seventeen years he farmed and in 1922 moved to Viborg and established the Independent Oil Co. In 1935 he retired from active business and divided his remaining years between his home in Viborg and his hunting lodge near Deerfield, S. Dak.

He remained in good health until January of this year. At that time he suffered a stroke which rendered him unable to be up and about for several months but subsequent strokes and loss of strength confined him to his bed in May and until the time of his death.

He was a Past Master and 49 year active member of the Masonic Lodge. He was also a member of the Masonic Consistory and IOOF.

He leaves to mourn, his widow, two sons, Peter of Hayward, Calif., and Vialas of Port Angeles, Wash., two daughters, Mrs. L. E. Jorgensen of Salem, S. Dak., and Mrs. Opal Eldridge of Pullman, Wash., two brothers, Lars and Peter of Sioux Falls, four sisters, Mrs. A. R. McClusky of Minneapolis, Minn.,

Mrs. E. R. Arneson and Mrs. O. D. Mikkelson of Sioux Falls, and Mrs. V. O. Larson of Yankton, many nieces and nephews and a host of friends. His parents and one sister, Mrs. John Johnson, preceded him in death.
