FUNERAL SERVICES HELD FOR FORMER RESIDENT

Funeral services for Arleen Beier were held April 29th at the First Baptist Church, Parker, with Rev. Frank G. Patterson and Rev. Bill Mashek officiating. Arleen Monk was born at Viborg, S. D., on June 24, 1913. She was the daughter of Arlo and Lena Monk. She attended school at Viborg where she graduated in 1931. Arleen was baptized at the First Baptist Church in Viborg as a young girl and later became a member of the First Baptist Church of Parker where she was a very active member her entire life.

On June 24, 1936, she was united in marriage with Louis Beier at Parker, S. D. To this union four children were born, Reed, Judy, Steve, and Jane. Following their marriage they farmed near Parker for a number of years before moving to a farm near Sioux Falls. In 1952 they moved to Plankinton, S. D., where they were employed at the State Training School for 10 years.

In 1972 they moved back to a farm near Parker where they've been operating a state group home for boys.

Having been in declining health since October, 1979, Arleen passed away at Sioux Valley Hospital on April 26, 1980, having attained the age of 66.

Besides her parents, she was preceded in death by one brother, Owen Monk.

Survivors include her husband, Louis; two sons, Reed and wife Beverly, and Steve and wife Cheryl, all of Sioux Falls, S. D.; two daughters, Judy Krumbach and husband Lee, and Jane Schmidt and husband Delwin, all of Parker; eleven grandchildren; one brother, Sheridan Monk of Tigard, Oregon; and Warren Pinney of Winner, S. D., who was raised with her as part of the family.
